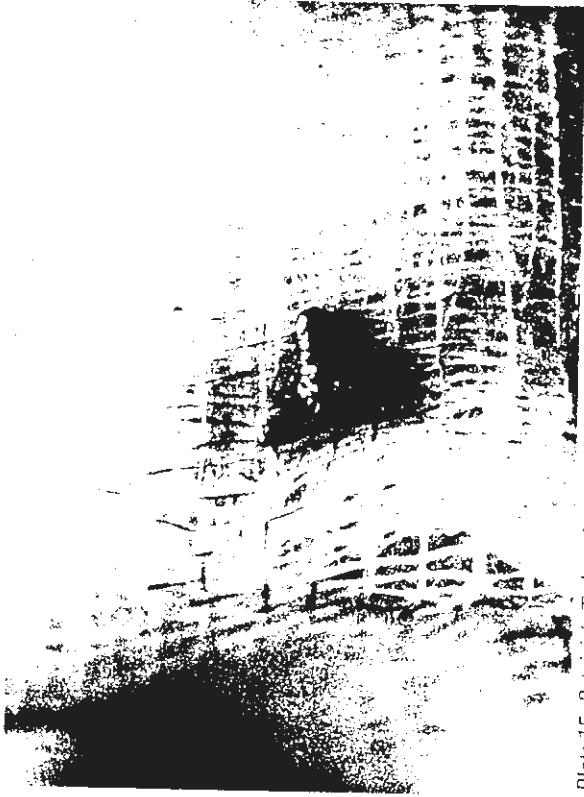


Plate 15. Patricia's T-shaped extracted object, covered with tough membrane.

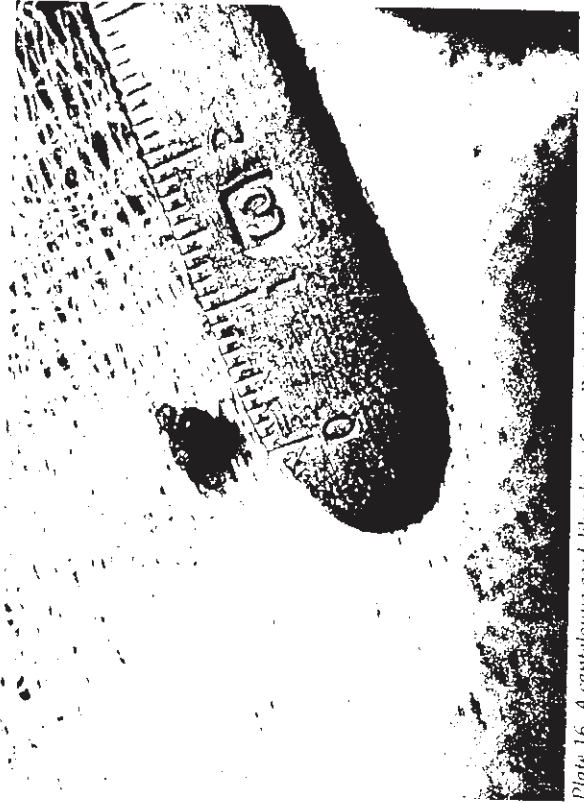


Plate 16. A canteloupe-seed-like object from Patricia's toe.

The Second Set Of Surgeries

Robert Bigelow had agreed at our previous meeting to fund not only the analysis of our specimens, but also the next set of surgeries, which now lay before us. Bob assured me that NIDS funds would be forthcoming if I complied with the wishes of their board, which included my providing them with a detailed budget for the surgeries and related research. I had given this much thought, and I had developed a general plan. My first task was to call the various individuals who would be involved on the professional level and obtain a cost estimate.

I went to my office one quiet afternoon when I was not seeing patients and made several phone calls. My first call was to Dr. Thomas Dodd, a friend who owned a large surgical facility in the San Fernando Valley. I told him that I was involved in a rather unusual research program and needed to rent his surgical facility for one day.

"I'm in need of some sophisticated equipment, such as a Fluoroscanner and a C-Arm, which I know you have," I explained.

"How many hours would you be using it for, and what is the date you had in mind?" Tom asked.

I gave this some thought. I did not want him to know my plan was just in the formative stage and that I was working on a budget for a third party who would ultimately be supplying the funds.

I answered, "I was considering a date in mid-May. This will depend on the patients' availability. I expect to do three or four cases, and that requires some coordination. As far as the surgical time is concerned, I believe it shouldn't take more than one hour per case plus time for the anesthesia and prep."

Tom said that his office manager would get back to me about the costs involved, and added, "Remember, I also have to pay the entire staff for the time you keep the suite open." I told him that I would wait for his assistant's call before I confirmed everything.

My second task was to find the chief surgeon for these cases, since Dr. A would not be available. I reviewed my list of possibilities and decided to call another old friend, Dr. Cass. I had known him for many years and, although I hadn't seen him for some time, I felt sure he was still in practice.

Dr. Cass seemed enthusiastic about helping with the surgeries, but, unfortunately, he was going to be out of the country when we needed him. He suggested Dr. Pratt, a young surgeon with whom he had worked, who had excellent skills, and would almost certainly do the cases.

I immediately dialed the number he had just given me, and Dr. Pratt answered. I introduced myself and told him Dr. Cass had recommended him for the surgeries. He asked me a number of medical questions pertaining to the patients, and he seemed satisfied with my answers. He said he would be available on the surgeries' tentative date of May 18, and his charges would be \$500 per case, or a total of \$1,500 for the three cases. I told him the costs would be acceptable.

A few days later I began composing a scientific budget for NIDS. The surgical costs were running higher than I had anticipated. Dr. Dodd's office manager had informed me that the costs of the operating room alone would be \$1,000 per hour. The additional cost to keep the remaining part of the facility open would amount to another \$300 per hour. I tried without success to convince her to lower the price.

Next, I called Mike Portanova, the official MUFON photographer and also a member of the executive board, for an estimate of costs for the still photographs and processing. He responded with a figure in the \$500 range.

So far so good; my budget was taking shape. The next consideration was the psychologist's fee. I called the woman we had previously used for the surgeries performed in August 1995. Although she was eager to work with us again, she would no longer provide her services free of charge, which did not come as a shock. Then she surprised me by saying that a portion of the testing should be performed by a clinical psychologist. She knew of someone who could do this for us, and, naturally, there would be a separate charge for her services. The total of all these arrangements

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would add up to about \$500 per case. I was taken aback, but I told her that I would submit her figures in my budget proposal.

Over the next few days I asked several key people to critique the document. Once everyone seemed satisfied, I sent it to Derrel for final approval. He in turn called me and gave the go-ahead to send it to NIDS.

The next week or so seemed to drag by. I did not want to make further arrangements until I had some word from Bigelow. Finally, late one afternoon, while I was busily engaged in my practice, I was told that I had a phone call from NIDS. It was Anne, Bigelow's secretary.

"Mr. Bigelow asked me to call you in reference to the budget proposal. The board has been looking at it and has a few questions. They would like to know the patients' names, medical histories, and experiences as abductees. They also would like to know if they meet your original criteria and if they have demonstrable evidence which shows on an X-ray, CAT scan or MRI?"

I was stunned at the nature and thoroughness of these questions. Once I recovered my wits, I told her I would happily provide all the answers and send them by FAX shortly. I typed the answers that night and FAXed them to both NIDS and Derrel.

Several days went by before I received another communication from Bigelow's secretary. She told me the board had approved the budget and she was going to FAX me a set of documents to read and sign, if I approved of them. On receiving the FAX, I read it over and considered it a fairly straightforward agreement. I signed the documents and FAXed them back immediately. It wasn't until later in the day that the realization of what had just transpired finally sunk in. My mood was elevated for the balance of the day.

This was the catalyst I needed to direct all my energies toward the project. The first step was to notify the patients that they would finally undergo the surgery. One by one I made the phone calls. There was a possibility that we would perform four surgeries instead of three. The fourth potential patient was none other than Whitley Strieber, world-famous abductee, author of the best-seller *Communion*, and writer of the Foreword to this book. We had been in constant contact over the previous months, and he told me that he thought that he had an implant in his ear. He had been traveling around the world on the lecture circuit and was scheduled to be in the Los Angeles area at the time of the surgeries.



Magazine and how I insisted on remaining anonymous. This certainly was a far cry from what I had just been through.

The year 1997 was spent traveling to numerous countries presenting our work with our findings to date. The results came in continuously a little at a time, slowly providing new clues to the puzzle.

Derrel and I were invited to present our work at the opening of the new Space, UFO, Science & Technology Center in Hakui, Japan. It was a great honor. We were two of the seven researchers invited to represent the United States. The others were Dr. Bruce Maccabee, Dr. Jesse Marcel, Jr., Dr. Richard Haines, Dr. Leo Sprinkle and Colin Andrews. We found the Japanese people to be very ceremonial, polite and extremely respectful of the work we all were doing in the field of ufology. The museum itself is a brand new edifice devoted entirely to the subject. There's nothing like it in the entire world, and I believe it will become a world center for UFO research.

Brazil was one of the most phenomenal countries we visited. The people there were plain simple folk. Anyone who is not convinced that the abduction phenomena have a basis in reality should visit this country. Derrel and I stood outside of the auditorium where the conference was held from about 9:00 A.M. until 9:00 P.M. talking with alleged abductees. Although most did not speak English and had to use an interpreter, they told us their stories. I watched the expression on their faces. In their eyes I saw sheer terror. Their faces would turn upward, mouths taut with lips that trembled and eyes filled with tears. These are some of the reactions they displayed while relating their stories. Most were similar to what we heard in the United States. The beings they described were the same. There were some extreme cases we heard about, however, which were much different than we had heard in our country. Some involved human mutilations, which never seemed to get reported in any news media, mainstream or otherwise.

Derrel and I have come to the conclusion that the alien abduction phenomenon is happening worldwide. There seems to be no limit in the number of alleged abductions or the extent of what the abductors do to their human captives.

During these trips we have been given many different specimens from either UFO crash sites or material which has come from the bodies of abductee victims. We will continue to process these specimens and the results will belong to all humankind.

they could get their monitor to focus on. Some of these armchair experts had a little knowledge in one field and some had knowledge in another, but all seemed to be experts in our field.

There were also moments of sheer joy, pleasure and adulation. One shining example occurred when I arrived for a conference in Tampa, Florida. I had just disembarked my flight and entered the terminal. As I walked through the gate, I heard my name called.

"Dr. Leir?"

I looked up and saw a small crowd of people up ahead. A short, trim, pretty lady in a green dress stood there waving frantically. I didn't know her at all. As I approached, she darted forward and said, "Hi, my name is Anne. I was on the flight with you and thought I recognized you. I am so happy to see you. Would you please give me your autograph? Also I would like to introduce you to my friends. They will be attending the conference and would be thrilled if you would give them your autograph."

It is difficult to describe my feelings at that occasion. There was a bit of non-reality involved. I couldn't believe this was happening to me. My thoughts raced. *How in the world did I get to a point where anyone would want my autograph?*

I did as the group requested and told them all I would look for them at the conference. When I arrived at the hotel there was more of the same. One of the moments which sticks in my mind was when I was standing at the registration desk waiting for the clerk. There were numerous people milling about, including a young man who seemed to be inquiring about something from various individuals. Soon he was headed my way. He walked directly up to me and asked, "Dr. Leir?"

"Yes, that's me."

He pulled a Federal Express envelope up from a bag he was carrying. "This just arrived for you. If you would just sign right here, please."

He leaned over, showed me where to sign and handed me the pen. I did as he asked and thanked him. Suddenly a voice behind me called my name. It was the desk clerk. I turned back around to tip the man who had just handed me the envelope, but, to my amazement, he had faded into the woodwork and was nowhere to be seen.

I could not help but muse and reminisce after this conference. I thought of the trip to Visalia my wife and I took shortly after the August 19th surgeries. I also recalled the phone conversation with Vicki from UFO



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What we removed was almost identical to the little cantaloupe-seed-shaped objects removed in 1995. As a matter of fact it was so similar that I would wager that, if all three were lined up, you could not tell one from the other.

Because the television network wanted to authenticate each step in the performance of the procedure, it became necessary to record each separate aspect of the preparation of the specimen, from the time it came out of the surgical wound until it arrived at the laboratory for testing. The soft-tissue portions were separated and placed in sealed containers, which were handed to the pathologist. Everything was documented via the studio's betacam. In addition, the hard, metal object was also placed in a sealed container, and Derrel, two other witnesses, and I initialed the seal. After 24 hours, the container was brought to my office, and we opened it in the presence of the television camera. We removed the object from the biological fluid and placed it into its drying receptacle, which was sealed, initialed and given to the network representative. After another 24 hours, we removed the biological covering and created two specimens—one biological and one metallic. The first was given to the pathologist and the latter was again sealed in another container, which, in turn, was placed in a metal box and locked with a key. A bonded courier took the box to its destination at the metallurgical laboratory.

We performed most of these procedures in our previous surgeries, so there were really no surprises until the following day when I received a phone call from the pathology assistant. What he told me made my eyes open wide. He said he was about to place the vial containing the blood serum, which previously housed the surgical specimen, into a centrifuge unit. Suddenly, he noticed the vial of serum was fluorescing. He became terrified and called me immediately to say that he would refuse to do any more work with that part of the specimen until the pathologist returned to the office.

So, once again, I will sit and wait until the results drift slowly in. The evidence is mounting, and we now know that we will provide more material for hard science to explore.

Biological Summary

We have performed a total of eight surgeries as of this writing in August, 1998. The results of these surgeries are summarized in Table 2, page 164. Four produced metallic objects covered by dark, gray, shiny membranes that could not be opened with a surgical blade. This mem-

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brane was shown to consist of a protein coagulum, hemosiderin, and keratin. All three of these substances are naturally occurring in the body, but our investigation has shown no record of this combination in the medical literature.

The soft tissues adjacent to the metallic objects underwent analysis, and the findings demonstrated conglomerations of nerve cells and a total lack of inflammatory response.

Three of the surgeries consisted of the removal of a skin lesion with an attached small BB-sized, greyish-white round ball in the underlying soft tissue. The pathological findings were similar in all three cases. We found solar elastosis, clusters of nerve cells, and either minimal or no inflammation present.

The seventh case was totally devoid of biological findings, but it did produce a crystalline or glasslike object. The eighth case produced another cantaloupe-seed-like object, similar to earlier ones.

Following are other factors that were found to be significant in Derrel Sims' study of 250 alleged alien abduction cases:

- All objects were obtained from the left sides of the bodies. A significant number of other cases have been investigated that also show the suspect objects occurring in the left sides of the bodies of the alleged alien abductees.
- Almost all of the specimens fluoresced under ultraviolet black light. This is another area of current investigation. We have experts in the field of biofluorescence studying this phenomenon.
- All subjects in our study showed abnormal reactions to procaine local anesthetics. Either the normal amount of anesthetic was not sufficient to produce the required anesthesia or there were frank outright allergic reactions to these compounds.
- All subjects exhibited a compulsion to consume salty substances and found it difficult to refuse food items such as potato chips, pretzels and other salty food. When consuming their ordinary meals they applied large amounts of common table salt.
- About 50% of the subjects suffered from xerophthalmia. (night blindness). The incidence is even higher when gender is considered. About 90% of the female portion of the study suffer from this condition.
- Only one person with an object in the body stated prior to surgery that he was able to hear voices and attributed this to the foreign object. After the surgery was performed the voices stopped for a short time but then returned.

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- 100% of the patients in the study appeared normal on their psychological profiles. According to our Ph.D. psychologist, they were all well adjusted and showed no indications of psychotic behavior.
- The preoperative laboratory tests performed on the surgical candidates were all within normal limits.
- The two patients who underwent hypnoanesthesia showed approximately a 50% more rapid healing process and took 90% less postoperative pain medication than average.
- The psychological postoperative adjustment period was wide and varied for all the patients in the study. One patient stated that he had initially lost his psychic abilities but that as time went on he felt they were returning. One of the other patients became completely divorced from the subject of ufology and wanted no further involvement. Three of the others continued to have additional abduction experiences following the surgeries. One of the patients is suspicious that he might have another implant in his body that was not removed at the time of surgery. All of the patients continue to live what appear to be normal, well adjusted lives, and each has an opinion regarding whether the surgeries should have been performed at all. About 90% of the sample stated that they would have made the same decisions again if given the opportunity. All are concerned about the scientific findings and wish the results were already available.

For more details see Derrel's two forthcoming books, *First Evidence* and *Alien Hunter*, which reflect his 34 years of research into these and other UFO phenomena.

The Metallurgical Findings

"What's in it?"

"What's it made of?"

"What's it do?" These are three of the most commonly asked questions. It should be remembered that although the questions are simple, the answers are not.

Our endeavors to fully answer these questions have cost us dearly in time and money. The answers have come slowly, and at this time are still incomplete. We continue to wait for the results of complex testing. Neither Derrel or I is a metallurgical scientist, and therefore we must rely on experts in that field to find and present the answers. Once the information is properly presented to the scientific community, then it is time for scientific thinkers to debate the issues.

I will introduce the material in the order that it was presented to us. Then I'll comment on the substance of the analysis.

The first metallurgical results came from the analysis performed by Los Alamos National Laboratories. These tests were done on the samples removed during the first two surgeries and on the little, greyish-white ball removed from the neck and shoulder area of the third case.

They have been designated the T-group, e.g. T-1, T-2, etc. The first test performed is called Laser-Induced Breakdown Spectroscopy (LIBS)

LIBS was used to determine the elemental composition of the samples. The samples were small rodlike materials one to two mm. in diameter and less than one cm. in length. Because of the small size of the sample surfaces when observed under a microscope, it was decided that LIBS was a suitable method to determine elemental composition because of its micro-sampling ability and relatively nondestructive analysis capabilities. Under microscopic examination, some of the samples appeared to be metallic, and all but one sample (T-4) were observed to have areas of visually different appearance (See Appendix 2, page 214 and following).

The method of analysis is as follows: LIBS is an elemental analysis technique in which powerful laser pulses are focused on the sample to generate a hot microplasma (10,000° K). Because the laser beam can be focused to a small area, this method has microsampling capabilities. The microplasma vaporizes a small amount of the sample (less than 50 nanograms) and excites the resulting atoms to emit light. The light is then collected, spectrally dispersed, and the resulting spectrum is recorded to determine the elemental composition. Because each element has a unique spectral signature, the elements can be identified by analysis of the spectrum. The intensity of the emission lines can be used to determine the concentrations of elements if the sample has uniform composition.

Table 1, page 168, shows the results of this elemental analysis. The table uses these standard chemical symbols:

- Al=Aluminum, Ba=Barium, Ca=Calcium, Cu=Copper, Eu=Europium, Fe=Iron, Mg=Magnesium, Mn=Manganese, Na=Sodium, Ni=Nickle, Pb=Lead, Ru=Ruthenium, Si=Silicon, Sm=Samarium, Ti=Titanium, W=Tungsten, and Zn=Zinc.

Under microscopic examination, some of the samples appeared visually to have areas of different color. These areas were analyzed separately. Different elemental compositions were found for the different areas. These are listed above. The area indicated as scaled was a larger diameter than

the main rod. This area appeared glassy-like and scaled (See Appendix 2, page 215).

The report and summary included the following recommendations:

"Additional tests not performed by us [Los Alamos National Laboratories] may indicate some unusual properties. These tests should include X-ray crystallographic and metallographic analysis to elucidate the sample structure (grain boundary structure, unusual metal phases, preferential grain growth)."

When these results were received, we immediately contacted NIDS and asked their recommendations. It was decided that further testing should be performed. We were informed their board would make a decision as to who should perform the next set of tests.

It took several weeks before we heard from NIDS again. They informed us that another world-class laboratory had been chosen for the next batch of testing. This laboratory was New Mexico Tech.

We received this information in a letter from NIDS which stated the following: "One purpose for NIDS' involvement was to establish some appropriate standards for initial testing of materials samples. A number of experts were consulted to determine what non-destructive tests were appropriate at this stage of the investigation. The battery of tests for structural, chemical and electromagnetic analysis recommended and conducted include:

- Density immersion technique in toluene
- Mechanical properties analysis including hardness and elastic modulus
- X-ray energy-dispersive spectroscopy
- Scanning electron microscopy
- X-ray diffraction pattern analysis
- Electromagnetic properties analysis
- All analyses were double blinded

We all waited with bated breath for the results from the New Mexico Tech laboratory. In a telephone conversation with John Alexander, who was directing the research at NIDS, I learned that there was a problem pertaining to reporting the results of the extensive examination performed by New Mexico Tech. It seems that the contract they signed did not include the terminology that would allow them to render an opinion pertaining to the test results. John told me they were working on the problem, and it

these samples were obtained from the human body. It stated that an iron-silver mixture imbedded into the body could cause a calcification reaction. It also stated that medicine and dentistry have used ceramic materials for many years. Unfortunately, the metallurgist's biological opinions did not hold water. In actual fact, no ceramic materials at all are used today because of the tremendous inflammatory reaction that occurs when they are placed into the body. There were many biological findings about our cases that report's author did not know. One was the complete lack of any inflammatory reaction. Also he did not know that a strange, gray, dense biological membrane covered the specimens. Last of all, there was no evidence of a portal of entry.

In summary, the metallurgical analysis has illustrated the following points:

The T-shaped object is composed of two small metallic rods. The horizontal portion contains a magnetic iron core that is harder than the finest carbide steel. (See Plates 11 and 12, page 102, and Plates 13 and 14, page 103.) A complex layer of elements covers the core, forming a cladding. One portion of this cladding has a crystalline band, which circles the rod. When viewing this rod, as seen in the electronphotomicrograph, it appears to be structured. One end is in the shape of a barb, while the opposite end is flat. In the center is a small depression. The shape of this depression conforms exactly to the shape of one end of the vertical rod. The vertical rod contains a similar cladding, but the core is composed of carbon instead of iron and it is magnetoconductive, but not magnetic. (See Plate 6, page 99.)

Theoretical Function

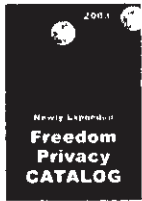
It would seem that the recovered items are structured objects that serve an as-yet undetermined purpose. We hope that further study will provide answers regarding function. There have been numerous individuals who have expressed interest in studying or postulating the function of these objects. One such person who has been working with us is Robert Beckwith, an electrical engineer. He has put forth a theory of how these objects might work. He is currently working on a book that will include his findings about them. We have been asked many times to speculate as to function. I feel it is safe to put forth theories, but they must be looked at scientifically and either proven or disproven. One such theory pertains to the objects' abilities to act as tracking devices or transponders, thus enabling the subject to be found anywhere on the globe. Another possibil-

ity is that they may act as behavior -controlling devices. We know that abductees seem to have compulsive behaviors. They sometimes wake their families in the middle of the night, ask them to get dressed and get in the car. Then they all drive out into the country, where the abductee might have an encounter, or perhaps nothing happens and they just return home. I believe a more plausible purpose might be that they monitor certain pollution levels or even genetic changes in the body, which may be similar to the way in which we monitor our astronauts when they are in space. Only more time, effort and study will answer these questions.

Conclusion—but Not The Last Word

Since not all our research data is in, what can we say at this point? Most of the metallurgical analysis indicates that the structure of these objects has an extraterrestrial origin (see Appendix 2, page 229). The composition of the objects includes metals whose isotopic ratios are clearly not from Earth. Moreover, the form of these objects is clearly engineered and manufactured with precision rather than being a naturally occurring form. If these scientifically derived results are not disproven by subsequent analysis, then we can firmly conclude that *some individuals with alien abduction histories have artificially manufactured objects in their bodies of a demonstrably extraterrestrial origin*. In short, we now have the "smoking gun" of ufology—hard, physical, scientific evidence of a continuing alien presence on Earth!

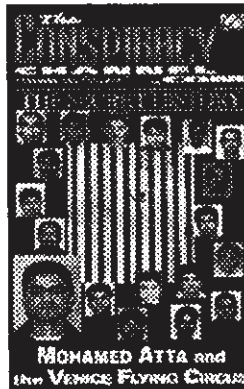
